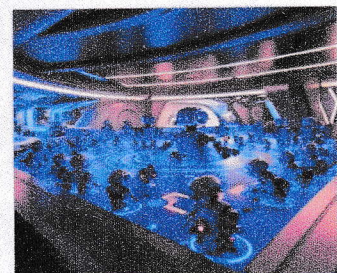
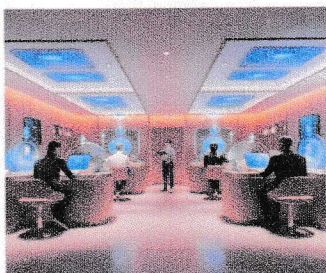

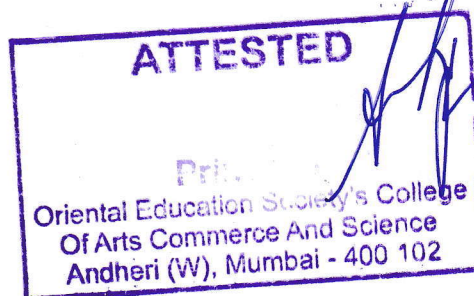

5. To encourage students to think socially and ethically, aligning business goals with social responsibility and community impact.



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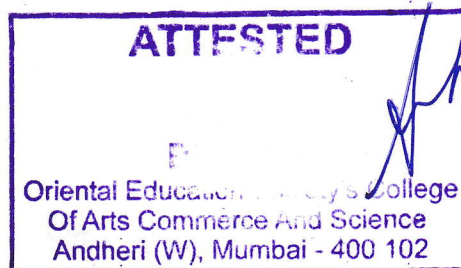

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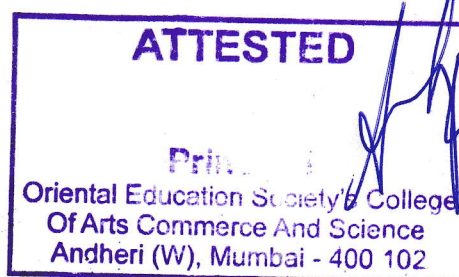
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
